You may be thinking you've stumbled across the social pages of the West Australian when you see the **Class 12 Ball Photos**. If you're lucky enough to have had the opportunity to watch these young people emerge from playgroup to now, your heart beats with love and appreciation for the stunning people they have become and gratitude for all the love and care that has surrounded them growing up. (Thank you parents and teachers!).

We've heard they had a great night! Thanks to everyone involved especially Kelly Kranz-Little (Guardian) and Karen Peradon-Alga (class assistant). The Ball was held at Burswood on Swan, a beautiful location on a perfect night.

At an art course recently, the instructor talked about a key component of artistic endeavour as being **KINDNESS**. And in that context it made sense but it also had much greater ramifications when you considered extending it into all parts of your life.

Basically the instructor highlighted that it is very easy to be critical of one's own art work. To be full of envy at another's art work. To lose enthusiasm and want to give up. To buy into the story of not being good enough.

The reason she said kindness was essential in being an artist, was to convert envy to appreciation and once we start to appreciate the other artwork, we open ourselves to learn from another person. Likewise, kindness towards oneself and appreciation of others can be converted into looking for positives and building on those and extending them into other parts of your life. We can use this again and again in our relationship with ourselves, our partners and especially our children. Kindness as the basis of how we look at the world, others and ourselves converts the cynicism and negativity into expressions of appreciation and finding strengths.

We all know that children grow and develop into healthy individuals when they are trusted and encouraged and we authentically focus on what is positive in them. They become withdrawn and disengaged when they are surrounded by judgement and inauthenticity.

Eschewing a focus on things that are "wrong" and developing a focus on what is "right" helps ourselves and helps others. In a practical sense, here at school, not engaging in stories of woe with our children but redirecting them to focus on what can be appreciated and what is working well sets them up for a more joyfilled and productive life, from an early age.

PWS STEINER TEACHER TRAINING COURSE

The School's inaugural Steiner Teacher Training course got off to a lively start on Friday 15th February with 35 enthusiastic trainees made up of teachers, parents, staff and others new to our school. It was wonderful to see such a large group of warmhearted people come together to learn and deepen their understanding of Anthroposophy and Waldorf Education.

Mark Phillips welcomed this group of teacher trainees with some circle activities typical of a child's day in any Steiner Primary School, which ended in much laughter and camaraderie among the cohort. Mark then presented an overview of Rudolf Steiner's own life journey and what he achieved, which was beyond prolific and reaches into a wide range of spheres of human activity.

After a nourishing and enlivening dinner break, Paul Lawrence took the group into a world of song and tone, introducing the trainees to the depth and tone of the place of song and singing in the Anthroposophical tradition of Steiner education.

Last Friday after another enjoyable session of singing with Paul, the group gathered to work with visiting lecturer, Eurythmist, Eurythmy therapist and psychotherapist Patries Orange who introduced Anthroposophy's spiritual picture of the human being.

As they settle into the routine of their Friday evenings at the School over the next two years, the trainees will follow the path that children in Waldorf Schools progress through in their journey of awakening from Class 1 to 7.

CLASS 5 MAIN LESSON





Restorative Practice in Our School: Introduction

PWS Philosophy

"The true aim of education is to awaken real powers of perception and judgement in relation to life and living. For only such an awakening can lead to true freedom". Rudolf Steiner

The principle aim of the Perth Waldorf School is the provision of high quality education based on the insights of Rudolf Steiner. In essence, Waldorf Education recognises the three soul faculties of the human being, namely, Thinking, Feeling and Willing which emerge and develop during childhood.

Our curriculum and methodology address the unfolding of these qualities in children by providing content which parallels the developmental stage of the children. Our teaching method, by recognising that these faculties emerge in a specific sequence in a child's life, is in harmony with the consciousness of the child. Taught this way, each subject serves to strengthen and balance these innate human qualities.

The Perth Waldorf School aims to:

- Provide an education so our students become balanced adult individuals, having developed clarity of thinking, sensitivity of feeling and strength of will.
- Inspire within the children a love of learning, a morality that strives for goodness, an appreciation of beauty and a pursuit of truth.
- Provide our students with knowledge, skills and the means to work competently in the world.
- Provide our students with values that will enable them to find their path in life.
- Inspire a sense of wonder at, and a healthy positive connection to, the world, arising from a knowledge of and responsibility toward the individuality of themselves and others.
- Inspire a sense of the spiritual dimension of life as well as a healthy respect for the physical.

These aims are held throughout the child's schooling but implementation of them will vary according to the development of the child.

The Restorative Practice Approach closely aligns with the ethos of our school and involves observation, hearing each other's story, reflection on the role we each play and seeking a shared outcome that helps each person involved to move forward positively.

Adopted by PWS in 2006, restorative practice is an approach to managing conflict, managing behaviour in an inclusive way and to restoring fractured relationships.

All staff are informed on how to facilitate a Restorative process.

Parents and Restorative Practice

Parents are invited to look at the type of language that is used and the way in which a facilitated conversation can be held and then to use it as a tool. Practice makes perfect.

The important point as a facilitator is to allow each person to be heard so that they "see" the other. A consequence of seeing the other is to develop a common understanding of what effect each person's behavior has on others and to reflect and learn over time.

It is hoped an agreed upon consequence can follow from a facilitated conversation that will be accepted by all involved and is "restorative".

At PWS, Restorative Practice is used with all ages including adults. The developmental age of each child is taken into account when using Restorative Practice at school and the authority of the wise adult is not supplanted by the approach.

Restorative Practice in Our School: Process

Restorative Practice aims to allow all parties to share their experiences and hear the experiences of others and then find ways to restore a situation so that all parties feel that justice has been done.

- Despite acknowledging this empowering approach, teachers and other staff retain the right and obligation to use their professional judgment and personal authority to deal with students and behaviour issues.
- The Restorative Justice approach requires all parties to be willing participants.

Corridor Conference Approach

Using the Restorative Practice approach, the teacher will usually act as a facilitator and would use the following language and questions as a guide.

To the Person Harmed	To the Wrongdoer
How have you been affected?	Does that seem fair? If not, what needs to happen?
What's the hardest or most	
difficult part?	Is there anything you would like to do
	or say?
What would you like to see

Formal Restorative Justice Conference

In situations of significant conflict or harm it may be necessary for a more formal "round table" type conference to take place. This may involve an independent experienced facilitator, and it may be appropriate for various parties to invite a supporter to accompany them.
